## **Demographic Update form**

Note that the form is still accessed by families by logging into the PowerSchool Parent Portal.

Please remember to check yes/no to the **Consent for Publication of Student Personal Information** and **Student Work** as this will allow the school to publish pictures in the yearbook.

<u>NS Lunch Program - www.NSLunch.ca</u>, click "Order Now" and select Halifax Regional Centre for Education to order the first two weeks of lunches.

Setting up your account is easy. To log into the ordering system, you use your My NS Account or a student GNSPES account. You then create a diner profile for your student. To do this, you will need to input your student's school and homeroom/class.

Once the diner profile is complete, you will be able to choose between two daily lunch options, place your order and access the confidential payment system.

Cold Weather Reminders: As the weather continues to get colder, we remind you that our P-6 students will be going outside for fresh air and exercise during recess and lunch. Please ensure that your children are dressed appropriately for the weather and prepared to stay outside for approximately 30 minutes at lunch time. Please ensure that all outerwear is labeled with child's name or initials, so it can be returned to the owner if found. Please put extra pants, socks, and mittens in your child's backpack for wet/snow

days! Once the snow comes, students who wish to play in the snow will require snow pants.

# **Cancellation of School**

By 5:30 a.m., staff will make recommendations to the Regional Executive Director of Education (or a designate), based on the information gathered and assessments of each area. The Regional Executive Director of Education makes the final decision based on this information. If it is safe to have students and staff on the roads and sidewalks, then schools will be open. If not, classes will be cancelled.

It is our goal to make the decision as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

School cancellation announcements will be made as early as possible on local radio stations, the Halifax Regional Centre for Education's school cancellation line (464-4636), via Twitter at http://twitter.com/HRCE\_NS and/or the HRCE website (<a href="www.hrce.ca">www.hrce.ca</a>). Also, you may sign up for e-mail or text message notifications at <a href="https://www.hrce.ca/families/cancellations/subscribe-notifications">https://www.hrce.ca/families/cancellations/subscribe-notifications</a>. Occasionally, during bad weather, there are times when the buses will not be travelling on some roads in our school catchment area. If this should occur, please leave a message on the absence line so that your child(ren)'s attendance will be recorded accurately in PowerSchool.

### **Midday Closure**

If the weather deteriorates, the HRCE can decide to dismiss students early. In the event of an early dismissal, the decision will be communicated to all schools as close to 11:00 a.m. as possible.

- Bused students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- Non-bused students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

In the event of an early dismissal, students in grades pre-primary to 6 will not be released from school unless parents/guardians or designates have been notified by the school.

If you have a child in junior high or high school, you should prepare and discuss a plan for what to do if schools close early.

Parents/guardians are reminded to ensure that your child(ren) are properly dressed for the weather conditions.
