#### **Universal Screening in Reading**

In September, classroom teachers spend time getting to know their students and who they are as learners. Schools will be using *Universal Screening in Reading* for Grade 1 and 2 students. This is one of the many ways teachers will assess learning.

#### What is Universal Screening in Reading?

It's a short (1–5 minute) activity that helps us see how your child is developing key reading skills. Think of it as a quick check-in on their reading journey, like looking at a map to see where they are and what might help them move forward.

## Why do we do it?

The screening helps teachers understand children's strengths and where they may need extra support. This allows us to plan instruction, so students get what they need to succeed in reading.

#### Important to know:

This is *not* a test. There's no "pass" or "fail." It's a way for teachers to ensure students are supported in their learning.

We recognize that the images recorded by this video surveillance system are personal information and, as with all other personal information, we take steps to balance privacy rights with safety and security concerns. Only designated staff have access to our video surveillance equipment and such access is restricted as required by law. The system is used to enhance school safety and to deter or take action in response to unlawful behaviour.

<u>Cold Weather Reminders</u>: As the weather continues to get colder, we remind you that our P-6 students will be going outside for fresh air and exercise during recess and lunch. Please ensure that your children are dressed appropriately for the weather and prepared to stay outside for approximately 30 minutes at lunch time. Please ensure that all outerwear is labeled with child's name or initials, so it can be returned to the owner if found. Please put extra pants, socks, and mittens in your child's backpack for wet/snow

days! Once the snow comes, students who wish to play in the snow will require snow pants.

## **Cancellation of School**

By 5:30 a.m., staff will make recommendations to the Regional Executive Director of Education (or a designate), based on the information gathered and assessments of each area. The Regional Executive Director of Education makes the final decision based on this information. If it is safe to have students and staff on the roads and sidewalks, then schools will be open. If not, classes will be cancelled.

It is our goal to make the decision as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

School cancellation announcements will be made as early as possible on local radio stations, the Halifax Regional Centre for Education's school cancellation line (464-4636), via Twitter at http://twitter.com/HRCE\_NS and/or the HRCE website (<a href="www.hrce.ca">www.hrce.ca</a>). Occasionally, during bad weather, there are times when the buses will not be travelling on some roads in our school catchment area. If this should occur, please leave a message on the absence line so that your child(ren)'s attendance will be recorded accurately in PowerSchool.
